In light of the measures recommended by the Federal Government and Governor Wolf the Borough of Mifflinburg has taken the following actions:

*The Borough Office and other facilities will be closed to public access through May 8, 2020. The Borough staff will be accessible by phone or email only during normal business hours. Any updates to this schedule will be posted on the Borough's website: mifflinburgborough.org

*The Borough will monitor and follow the Governor's orders with regard to re-opening as the rules are laid out.

COVID-19 UTILITY INFORMATION

Customers who do not participate in the automatic payment system are asked to either mail utility payments or to drop their utility payments into the box located in the entry to the Municipal Building.

The Borough of Mifflinburg understands that the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted many of our residents' lives. In an effort to help customers, the Borough will not be assessing penalties or making terminations during the months of April and May 2020

Customers are encouraged to contact the Borough office to make payment arrangements for any delinquent balances. Special arrangements will allow customers to spread the balance over three months, rather than face utility

SPRING DROP OFF

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We're Not All Infected, But We've All Been Affected

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has not just threatened the physical health of millions but also wreaked havoc on the emotional and mental well-being of people around the world. All of us have been affected by this pandemic in some way. Some of us have lost jobs, and many cannot see or are worried about our family members. Many of us are struggling due to increased isolation, and most of us are fearful of getting sick. Some of us feel angry because we do not believe our peers are taking the proper preventative measures. Many of us are sad that important milestones in our lives have been disrupted. Feelings of grief, anxiety, and helplessness are rising as people face an uncertain future. I think most of us can acknowledge we will never go back to things exactly as they were.

This phrase was coined by Victor Frankl, a Holocaust survivor, psychiatrist and writer. Tragic optimism is the ability to maintain hope and find meaning in life despite its pain, loss, and suffering. It is how people respond to adversity that leads them to growth. Without minimizing their suffering, people who grow after a crisis are those who try to make sense out of what happened and understand how it changed them. They search for positive meaning.

By now we know what to do to get through this horrific time. We know to take preventive measures, try to structure our days, take time for self-care, perhaps indulge in some of the things we never had time for, limit our news exposure, and get our news only from reputable resources such as the CDC and WHO. We know to use time to connect to our spirituality through nature, reading, or meditation, and to check-in regularly with our family and friends. This is how we cope but it does not move us into the depth of the psyche as deeply as meaning-making does. While we cannot avoid suffering, it is important to learn to suffer in a way that permits us to see the positive and light in humanity.
